


Dear Parents/Carers,

Bullying is not the odd occasion of falling out with friends, name calling, arguments or fights. These are also not tolerated at Carlton Mills and must be reported but I would like you to discuss the term bullying with your child to ensure that they understand the word and use it correctly. Any report of bullying will be fully investigated by myself.
